

## Blended Mobility / Erasmus+ Scholarships

It is possible to get an Erasmus+ scholarship when your study/internship abroad is a “Blended Mobility”.

Blended Mobility means that part of your studies/internship is online (in your home country / or abroad) and part of it is on physical (abroad on location).

You will get an online language course, sign an Erasmus+ Learning Agreement and your study/internship is recognized with credits as if you were in a regular Erasmus+ period abroad.

The days of your Erasmus+ Blended Mobility count for the number of maximum 360 days that you can have for Erasmus+ during 1 study cycle (Bachelor or Master).

### Which requirements apply?

- Blended mobility is planned from the start, prior to start of your activity abroad.
- For Erasmus+ the requirement is that your plan should be to first have online mobility (from your home country), and afterwards physical mobility (in the host country).
- The physical part (abroad) should have a minimum duration of 2 months.
- You only receive the Erasmus+ scholarship for the period you are actually abroad.
- Register as a regular Erasmus application your stay abroad in Mobility Online. When you have the question “Type of Mobility” please selected Blended Mobility.
- Documentation upon return (Transcript of Records, Statement of Host or Traineeship Certificate) needs to specify the online/physical mobility.

### Note:

- If part of your online part takes place abroad (in the host country) you will also receive the Erasmus+ scholarship for that period. So if you move abroad and will take classes or work on your internship from your temporary house abroad, it counts as being abroad.
